

## Roman Conquest

Rome jeweler Fabio Salini has built his business on rock crystal, which he says "gives a piece brightness and freshness. You see it, but you don't." The same cannot be said of Salini's showstopping chokers, which boast 18-karat white gold bars lined with sapphires and rock crystal (about \$58,000), shiny black onyx blocks embellished with rose-cut diamonds or crocodile bands decorated with carved jade and ruby (about \$1,700). Salini, who has worked for Cartier and Bulgari, started his own line a decade ago and opened his first store in a 15th-century building last year. He designed the vaultlike space and the furniture himself, and oversees every aspect of the business. The attention to detail has paid off: Salini counts Queen Rania of Jordan, who owns 15 pieces, among his biggest clients, and he once designed a mother-of-pearl, yellow sapphire and diamond cross for Pope John Paul II to bring to a religious site in his native Poland. -J.R.
